#### Do you use a single footed cane?

Do you feel shaky in need of more support? Add 2 or more extra feet on that cane to make it a tri or even quad footed cane. Contact the place where you found the cane – Walgreens or Handicapped Services.

Need to climb stairs – add a chair lift to your stairs. Need a lift to get from your bed to chair or to the bathroom or commode? Need to roll your chair from room to room – Add guides on the wheelchair arms.

I have asked these questions as they come to mind.

Remember: Cement doesn't bounce or give if you fall on it.

Walkers can be pushed or have someone push a wheelchair, a walker can be folded.

A motorized wheelchair has a battery that needs charging.

Metro Mobility can move you for a price as they have a lift to get you on the van and you cannot drive.

Do you find it hard to pick things up from the chair and off the floor? There is an item at Walgreen's call the Golden Retriever and the other is the Pick Stick.

AARP locally will help put you in touch with people in businesses that can help you.

I hope you have found this information helpful.
