From Pastor Preuss...

It can appear that anything having to do with making sacrifices is best left to someone else.

Most people who would like to see taxes raised for whatever reason, mean other peoples' taxes. Many of us who think a strong national defense is important would prefer that neither we nor our loved ones should have to serve in our nation's armed forces. Some members in many congregations are convinced that Sunday School is critical for the youngest children of God, but few of those members choose to teach or help in any way.

The temptation for each one of us is to think of any notion of self-sacrifice as the antithesis of self-fulfillment; and that the fewer commitments we have, the more free "we" are to be "us."

Especially during the Season of Lent we who are the Church of Jesus Christ are confronted with a different reality.

In the Temple of Jesus' day, priests served around the clock offering sacrifices of all kinds, as people offered animals of all sorts and other inanimate gifts in praise or thanksgiving to God, or as a sign of their repentance. It was that Temple and those liturgical practices that Jesus called contrary to God's will and hope for God's people, because

finally the people did not offer themselves but something else.

What does it mean that the Son of God who in effect rejected the Temple and its theology and practice of sacrifice is nonetheless called "The Great High Priest?" And what does it mean that he offered his own life to prove his love for us?

Does that mean that we are indeed loved and forgiven not because we make some sacrifice, but because loving us is in God's very nature? And if it does, then does that make any sacrifice we make unnecessary or irrelevant? Or is our own self-sacrifice a reflection of Jesus' own, and something God asks of us for the sake of his other children who benefit from that which we give—as well as a fulfillment of God's own divine purpose for me and you?

This Lenten Season we will hope to reflect on those sorts of questions as we focus on "Our Great High Priest and His Passion."

I hope and pray that you will choose to join us for worship.

Please sign-up there if you are able to provide a soup or a dessert. We need two soup makers each week to make 3 gallons of each kind of soup (3 ice cream pails.) You could make it way ahead of time and freeze it. Or, you could make the soup in the kitchen at church (the night before and put it in the refrigerator or make it on Wednesday.) Also, you can be reimbursed for your expenses.

Budget - Two numbers tell the tale of the end of our 2014 budgetary year: (\$35,403.66) and \$3,829.74. At the end of November we were (\$35,403.66) behind in terms of the budget. Our year end position at the end of December held us at \$3,829.74. There is more nuance and detail that goes into the budget, but to put it simply: Giving in December was simple amazing. We are awestruck by the generosity of the entire congregation. Those who push their means every week and every month in order meet their pledged amount and those who take their ability to write sizable checks at the end of the year as a privilege and a responsibility are both incredibly important to the operation of Cross Lutheran Church. It is just this simple: our faith and our community keep us together as a church, but money keeps the lights and the heat and the phone on. Thank God and thank you for your responses to our financial needs in 2014.

The Board of Stewardship is looking forward to 2015 as an opportunity to continue on with the opportunities and challenges that God blesses us with. We thank the congregation for their continued support.


